- Provides direct federal assistance
- Funds Nevada's State Program
- Awards competitive grants to communities
- Multi-faceted program redevelops sites
- Provides funding for technical assistance
- Ability to leverage other opportunities

Beatty Habitat Trails Project:


A story of appreciation and preservation


Goals:

- Improve safety of former mine sites
- Develop trailways and preserve habitat

Challenges:

- Unsafe conditions from historic mining
- Gathering data necessary for planning







- Mine Adit Survey provided to Nevada's Mine Scarred Lands Program
- Trailways design and agency support
- On-going habitat restoration of the Trails and conservation of the Amargosa toad - Service Citizens Award from US FWS
- Eco-tourism economy launched and thriving


The funding ladder reached almost \$7 Million in grants and in-kind assistance.

- Finalize Plan for Fairgrounds
- Initiate Fairgrounds Development

Challenges:

- Understanding land patent conditions
- Community disagreement/contention
- Community frustration
- Funding to implement plan



- Leadership built consensus for direction and plan
- Project implemented in stages
- Internal specialists and relationships built the funding ladder
- Flexibility to change funding rungs

Fish Lake Valley Community Center Expansion:

A story in shortening the ladder to reach your destination faster

Goals:

- Adequate facilities for local community health
- ADA-compliant parking and access to existing community center

Challenges:

- No County-wide communications network to access local government meetings
- Insufficient local donations and volunteer labor





- Expanded Multipurpose community center
- Access to telemedicine and public meetings
- ADA-compliant building access

Wye Road Parcel: A story of public-private partnerships

Goals:

- Address food desert designation by US Department of Agriculture
- Consolidate services to one location

Challenges:

 Private owner with environmental liability

Components	Support/Funding Rungs
Redevelopment options	Brownfields Education/Outreach
Phase I &II ESA on full parcel	Brownfields Program
Parcel Sub-Divided	Inyo County & Owner
Developer to address food desert	Private Investor (Grocer)
Remaining portion of parcel undeveloped	Brownfields Education/Outreach
Phase I ESA on remaining parcel	Brownfields
Developer to address local government service needs	Public/Private Partnership





Parcel redeveloped into two community projects



Inyo County Consolidated Office Building

- Inyo County services co-located in one building to facilitate public access
- Property funded through public-private partnership with long-term lease agreement and end-of-lease purchase option

Development Cost: \$17.9 Million



Grocery Store

- Local food access
- Private investment created development opportunities

Development Cost: \$3.4 Million



Lessons Learned

Have a Clear Goal

- Project Objectives
- Broad net for ideas
- Build a team
- Establish a champion
- Understand boundaries
 - Land Use restrictions
 - Funding limits
 - Use regulations as tools

Recognize Challenges

- Work with funders in advance
 - Ask questions
 - Explore opportunities
 - Share ladder strategy
 - Seek guidance

Build Your Funding Ladder

- Be persistent
 - Obtain debriefs for unsuccessful grants
 - Pivot toward opportunities
- Volunteers have value
 - Recognize and celebrate them
 - Understand their skills and limits
- Matching requirements
 - Cash is king but In-Kind is creative
 - Track/document participation and donations early
- Consider public/private partnerships
- Celebrate Your Outcomes




